
No Fish, no catch!




- Ø You can't, however, catch fish in a pool that doesn't have any in it!



One Week Of Evangelism



You cannot catch fish in a pool that does not have any in it...

On the basis of 10% of the church membership you can work out an approach to determine the work involved in running an EACH ONE BRING ONE week of evangelism.

EXAMPLE

| 1. | CHURCH MEMBERSHIP | = 80 |
|----|---|--------------------|
| 2. | The GOAL is 10 % of the church membership of 8 | = 8 saved |
| 3. | In ATTENDANCE to hear the talks, 8 x 10 To see 8 saved you will need to have 80 in attendance to hear the talks. | = 80 in attendance |
| 4. | INVITED personally to the event, 80 x 10 To have 80 in attendance to hear the talks you will need to personally invite 800. | = 800 invited |
| 5. | EACH CHURCH MEMBER invites 800 ÷ 10 If each church member is doing their part they will have to be praying for 10 people and personally | = 8 people |

The problem is, not every church member will get involved, which means that once more, a few of the church member have to do all of the work, instead of all the church members doing all the work to reach out with the Gospel.

You cannot sow where it has not been cultivated, and you cannot reap what has not been sown. Start cultivating by building bridges of friendship, and sowing by prayer and sharing.

INTRODUCTION





They all joined together constantly in prayer Acts 1:14

As much prayer as possible should be arranged for the week of EACH ONE BRING ONE

No prayer - no interest - no blessing. Little prayer - little interest - little blessing. Much prayer - much interest - much blessing.

INFORM

Keep all the church members well informed of the plans for the week of EACH ONE BRING ONE so that everyone knows what events are being held, where and when. Produce an information sheet at regular intervals.

PRAYER MEETINGS

- 1. PERSONAL Private prayer should be encouraged. Be faithful in prayer. Romans 12:12
- 2. CHURCH Regular prayer meetings should concentrate on the EACH ONE BRING ONE week.
- 3. HOME

Area prayer meetings should be set up in homes.

4. PRAYER CLOCK

Twenty-four hour round-the clock prayer by sign up.

5. PRAYER TRIPLETS

Three Christians meeting once a week, each praying for three non-Christian friends.

PRAYER TOPICS

- 1. That God will be glorified in everything.
- 2. That the speaker will come in the Lord's strength.
- 3. That people will accept the invitation to come.
- 4. That people will be saved.
- 5. That seed will be sown.
- 6. That follow-up will be effective.

Day Schedule



These are the *possibilities* for a day of EACH ONE BRING ONE

The aim is not to fill the day but to plan the best events for your church.

1. BREAKFAST

Men Women Mixed Each One Bring One

2. COFFEE MORNING

Women Young mothers Senior citizens All ages Each One Bring One

3. LUNCHTIME

Men Women Mixed Each One Bring One

4. AFTERNOON Free!

5. EVENING

Dinner or informal meal for a specific group. Men Women Couples Singles Youth Each One Bring One

The aim is to provide a warm, informal setting for the presentation of the Gospel. We want to provide an arena where people can accept Christ and also a setting that will encourage others to return to some similar event. We are not trying to hit them between the eyes so that they will never return!

IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT EVERY CHRISTIAN BRINGS A NON-CHRISTIAN FRIEND OTHERWISE THE **AIM IS LOST**

There are four main events that are essential for an EACH ONE BRING ONE week; the Women's dinner, the Men's dinner, the Couples dinner and the Youth evening. These should be considered as standard.

A well-planned breakfast can be very successful but only it is a possibility for the early birds.

There should be at least one women's coffee morning during the week. Sometimes it is better to have two smaller coffee mornings than one large one.

Lunch is an excellent time for getting many non-Christian friends to attend. This has to be well planned especially with regards to the timing.

The youth evening should be far more informal and food is essential! The youth Pastor/ Leader is usually well up on what is necessary for such an evening.

ALL OF THESE EVENTS SHOULD BE PLANNED WITH "EACH ONE BRING ONE" AS A REQUIREMENT. THIS IS ESSENTIAL IF THE GOAL FOR THE EVENT IS TO BE ACCOMPLISHED.

We are not trying to pack the week but rather to plan the best events for your church.

It is always better to do a few events well than to fill the week and do it badly.

1. VENUE: CHURCH OR HOTEL?

- A. The church hall nicely decorated is excellent.
- B. A hotel can be used if it is priced well.
- C. A private home should be used as a last resort.

- A. Friends and Neighbours Coffee morning.

Dinner

Men's, Women's, Couples, Singles and Youth

The Dinner can be as formal or informal depending on the situation.

1. VENUE - CHURCH OR HOTEL?

- A. The venue is dependent on the locality of the church and the facilities available in the church.
- B. The venue is dependent on the type of people you are trying to reach both socially and religiously.
- C. The venue is never as important as the event.

2. NAME FOR EVENT

- A. Each One Bring One Dinner.
- B. Friends and Neighbours Dinner.
- C. Food For Thought Dinner.
- D. Guest Dinner.

3. EACH ONE BRING ONE

- A. Everyone must bring a non-Christian guest.
- B. Always endeavour to bring a 'warm contact.'
